A feature of the 1928 accounts is the very welcome addition of the underwriting profit from marine insurance. The 1927 account has been closed by a transfer to suspense account, and the balance of £32,146, equal to 6.6 per cent. of the premiums, represents the final profit of the account. This sum compares with only £11,132 in respect of the preceding closed account. The 1928 account has opened with a premium income of £541,721, compared with £483,717 in the 1927 account. Moreover, the claims experience of the first year has been decidedly more favourable than that of the preceding year, the claims ratio being 82.1 per cent. compared with 85.1 per cent. The fire and accident departments have been operating very rapidly, and the consequent expense of the establishment has hitherto prevented the full fruits of their results being made available. The fire department, however, last year yielded a modest profit of £5,259, equal to 2.9 per cent. of the premiums, compared with nil in

factors are, of course, high money rates and the beginning of loss of confidence among business men in the immediate outlook. So far only the building industry has shown any actual falling off, but that has been rather marked, and some companies closely allied with it are finding earnings decreasing moderately.

Criticism of Federal Reserve policy has the country by the ears. Prominent bankers, Congressmen, business men, economists and people in nearly all walks of life are airing their views through the public Press and otherwise. Business men are naturally alarmed lest money for their purposes be hoarded, and lest a stock market crash, which would wipe out private savings, affect public purchasing of commodities and shatter confidence, crown the efforts of the Federal Reserve Board. They fear that, to cure the stock market toothache, the Reserve Board may



Provided that nothing herein contained shall extend, or be taken to extend, to Russian vessels having on board any officer in the military or naval service of the enemy, or any article prohibited or contraband of war, or any dispatch of or to the Russian Government. And it is hereby further ordered by Her Majesty, by and with the advice of Her Privy Council as aforesaid, that any Russian merchant vessel which, prior to the twenty-ninth day of March now last past, shall have sailed from any foreign port, bound for any port or place in any of Her Majesty's Indian territories, or foreign or colonial possessions, shall be permitted to enter such port or place, and to discharge her cargo, and afterwards forthwith to depart without molestation; and that any such vessel, if met at sea by any of Her Majesty's ships, shall be permitted to continue her voyage to any port not blockaded."

The Lords Commissioners of the Treasury have again had under their consideration the proclamation prohibiting the exportation of arms and other warlike stores, in consequence of numerous applications from traders to be permitted to follow their business when the articles are not intended for warlike purposes. Their lordships have issued a minute, stating that while they are desirous of using every means in their power to prevent the improper export of such articles,

and general brass founders, and brass and iron bedstead makers have quite sufficient to keep all the hands in work at all the manufactories. We have similar reports of the light and heavy steel toy trades, which comprise such a variety of manufactures, that very little of depression can exist when they are uncomplaining. We have similar reports as to the state of the steel pen trade. The sword makers have more orders than they can execute for the time being, inasmuch as every order is required to be completed immediately—(especially as regards officers' swords)—and not a morning's post passes without pouring fresh orders upon the manufacturers."

The *Miranichi Gleaner*, of March 11, says:—"The warehouses of the Great West, says the *Boston Journal*, are overflowing with immense quantities of grain and flour. The *Burlington Gazette*, of the 10th ult., states that at no time in the history of that city has the same amount of flour and grain been on hand. In Chicago, says the *Chicago Tribune*, the warehouses along the river are full of grain, and several operators have been obliged to withdraw for lack of storage room. There are 67 vessels in port, which will probably take, with the opening of navigation, some few weeks hence, 700,000 bushels of grain for the East."

Use the PRE operator to search for exact phrases: When looking for items that discuss farming in the EU, enter farming PRE/10 EU. This search will find the term farming where it precedes within 10 characters or spaces of the term EU.

Mix phrases and single search terms: e.g. enter "Economic Monetary Union AND inflation".

Use plural or other word endings:

Use the [truncation \(wildcard\)](#) feature to retrieve various forms of a word, e.g. the term Jew* retrieves items that contain the words Jew, Jews or Jewish.

Try using synonyms: e.g. enter "car OR automobile".

Field length: Search terms or phrases cannot exceed one hundred characters or twelve words.

Check your spelling: If you type womin instead of women your search will not produce any results, unless you have activated [fuzzy searching](#).
